Vera Verb laughs loudly and runs quickly.

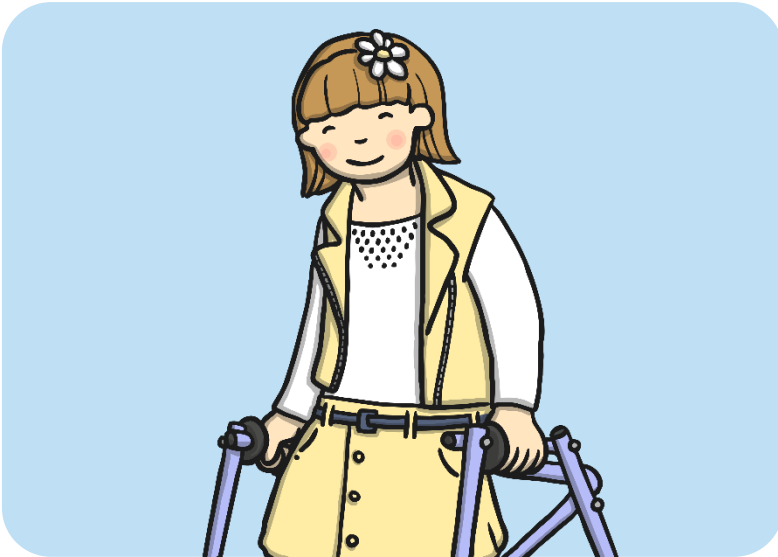


That's my job - to tell you more about a verb.
