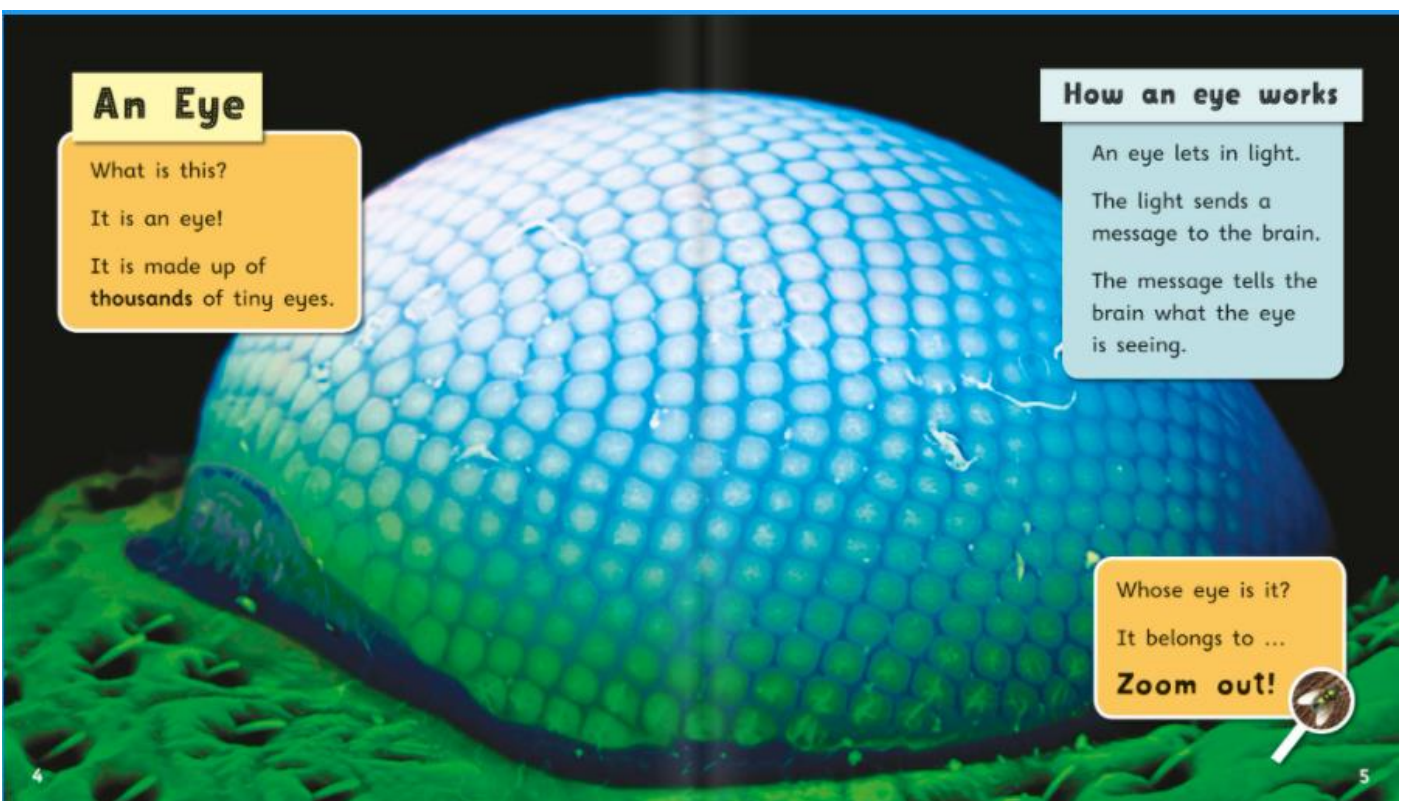

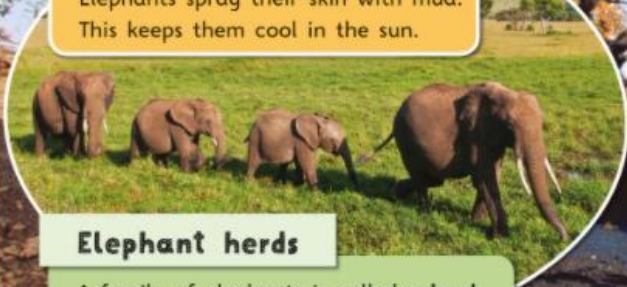

The **continent** of Africa is very big and very hot.

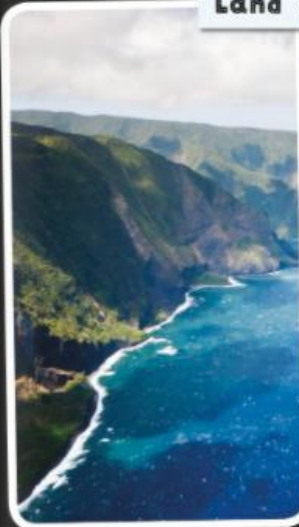
It has **deserts**, plains, mountains and forests. There are 55 different countries in Africa.

Glossary

billion: one thousand million (1 000 000 000)

continent: a huge area of land that can include many different countries

deserts: areas of land with very little rainfall and few plants

herd: a group of animals

Masai: a group of people who live in Kenya and Tanzania

plains: large areas of flat countryside with few trees

planet: a large ball of rock or gas that revolves around a star

solar system: a sun and the planets that revolve around it

thousands: numbers such as 3000 or 6000

universe: the stars, the planets and everything that exists
